# A New Local Fueling Station for You and Your Car

The new fueling station being built on the northbound side of the Deer Springs exit will be opening in the 2nd quarter of 2022. It will be a Circle K branded station and convenience store. It is owned by KA Enterprises, a San Diego owner and operator of fueling stations and commercial real estate. It is designed to serve the northbound I-15 traffic and communities east of the freeway more conveniently. The station will have 16 gas pumps. According to Eugene Marini, the KA Asset Manager responsible for this project, “This Circle K will have a larger than normal convenience store and will be an asset to

the area.” Most of the construction is expected to be completed by early March. There will still be quite a bit of work before the station and store open, including completing signage and stocking the store and fuel. This location will be managed by Circle K corporate itself. Marini told me it is an important account for Circle K and will be run with a best-in-class management team. KA originally planned to manage the store itself, however Circle K was keen to run it and KA agreed. KA is ground leasing the property to Circle K. The total cost of this project, including land purchase and construction, is over \$7 million. KA acquired the property in 2017.

Previously there was a fountain shop on the location. “KA has been run by the same 3 partners in San Diego for nearly 30 years,” Marini said. “They are great people and take good care of their employees.” KA Enterprises, based in Sorrento Valley, was founded in 1995 by equal partners Kayvon Agahnia, Kambiz Agahnia and Ken Assi. Coincidentally, the three men have the same initials, hence the name KA Enterprises. The Circle K company was founded in 1951 by Fred Harvey. It was sold and purchased a few times and

is now owned by Montreal, Canada-based Alimentation Couche-Tard, Inc. Today, Circle K has around 7,200 stores overall in the United States and over 14,000 worldwide. Circle K has a mobile app and Easy Pay card that can save you up to 30 cents per gallon on gas every time you fill up. Circle K’s fresh ground coffee is 100% sustainably sourced. If you are a fan of Circle K’s Polar Pop drinks (previously called Thirst Busters) and other treats, you won’t have long to wait. They are coming to Hidden Meadows soon.

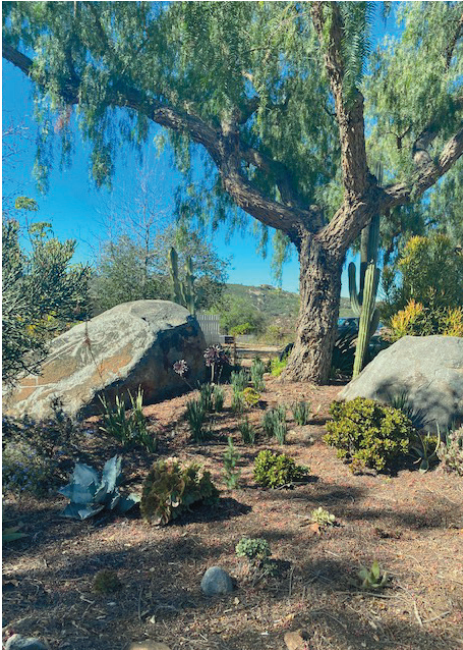

## Elfin Forest Reserve Hike

Saturday, March 12, 2022 at 8:00 AM  
Way Up Trail - Elfin Forest Reserve / Reserve parking area on Harmony Grove Road

Join the Valley Center Trails Association (VCTA) for a moderately strenuous three mile hike at Elfin Forest Recreational Reserve. The hike starts at the Reserve parking area on Harmony Grove Rd. Parking is free. Bring water, and wear appropriate sun protection and footwear - there is little shade on the trail. This out and back hike ascends steeply and continuously for one mile. At the top, we'll take a break at one of the lookouts. Views are spectacular on a clear day, including the ocean, the Olivenhain Reservoir, and snow-capped mountains to the north. On our return we'll take the Botanical Trail, which includes a stream crossing - bring your poles if you aren't comfortable hopping from rock to rock. Allow at least two hours.

The Reserve gates open at 8. Hike begins at 8:05. Everyone is welcome and no pre-registration is required.

Directions: Take Valley Parkway to Avenida Del Diablo. Go right/north on Avenida Del Diablo for 0.6 mile. Turn right on Citracado Parkway. Go 0.1 mile. Turn left on Harmony Grove Village Parkway. Go 0.4 mile. Turn left on Harmony Grove Road. Go 2.2 miles to the reserve staging area on the left.

Heavy rain during 24 hours before hike or steady rain one hour in advance of start time cancels hike. Notice of cancellation will be posted on the VC Trails Facebook page. If you don't use Facebook and want notice of cancellation, email [anitanoone@gmail.com](mailto:anitanoone@gmail.com) at least two days before the event.

## BOOK REVIEW - By Lynn Clark

Quote before the first chapter. "A learned man is an idler who kills time with study. Beware of his false knowledge: it is more dangerous than ignorance." George Bernard Shaw from "Man and Superman"

Well I'm not sure that this quote should be so harsh on the explanation of the term "idler" being synonymous with a "learned man". I know as I age (and become an "idler") I find reading the best source for stimulating my brain. This book certainly did that, and that is why I highly recommend it. The novel is based on the personal experience of the author and her child.

"The Hidden Child" by Louise Fein

Definition of Eugenics: "measures intended to improve the qualities of a human population by control of inherited characteristics"\* The American Century Dictionary. Author's research concerning Eugenics is at the back of the book.

The year is 1928. Edward and Eleanor Hamilton are a very happily married couple. They are considered one of the "new rich" or "wealthy upstarts" in England. Edward is one of the educators or "voices" informing the public about a new movement called Eugenics.

Mabel is their bright fun-loving daughter and is the joy of Eleanor's life. When Mabel is four years old she suffers an epileptic seizure in front of the mailman. It is a frightening experience to see, and Eleanor convinces him that it is nothing to worry about, and she would appreciate it if he would keep what he witnessed to himself. He agrees and so begins the deception and concealment of the incident.

As the seizures become more violent and Eleanor can no longer control the situation, the reality of Mabel illness makes her realize she is losing the battle. Edward, whose professional life is in direct conflict with his home life, insists that they seek treatment in a clinic for children with impairments. Mabel enters the clinic. Her health continues to deteriorate. There will be times in the book when you will pity Edward, and others times when you will intensely dislike him.

What really draws you to the book is that the author gave the disease a platform and personality to interact with the reader. The persona of the disease relates the fight for control of the child's brain and body in contrast to the unyielding love of the mother fighting for the child's life. When Mabel enters the clinic the disease says "She is my girl now. But there is another recent arrival...a doctor. A young and arrogant one. ... Who thinks he can get the better of me." It was quite a unique addition to the story and an interesting battle for supremacy .... who will claim Mabel ?

The following is a poem written by the author at the end of the book concerning her own daughter.

"You are so young, but you put me to shame,  
Your forgiving affection lifts my pain;  
For I can see you will never give in,  
And succumb to the monster you carry within."

## Impending emergency aqueduct shutdown

The following message has been released by the Valley Center Municipal Water District:

"Valley Center Municipal Water District (District) has been advised by its wholesale supplier of an impending emergency shutdown to the treated water aqueduct that delivers water to the western portion of the District.

"The aqueduct will be shut down to accommodate repairs to Pipeline 4, of the San Diego County Water Authority's 2nd Aqueduct. This shutdown is scheduled to begin on Tuesday, March 1, 2022 at 1 a.m. and remain off for approximately 10 days. However, these dates may be adjusted depending on the severity of the pipeline repair. The District will notify you of any updates to this schedule.

"As a result, water flows to the District's VC 7 and VC 8 connections points will be off-line. This will severely limit flows into the western portion of the District and the water remaining in storage will be only for domestic use and fire protection during the shutdown.

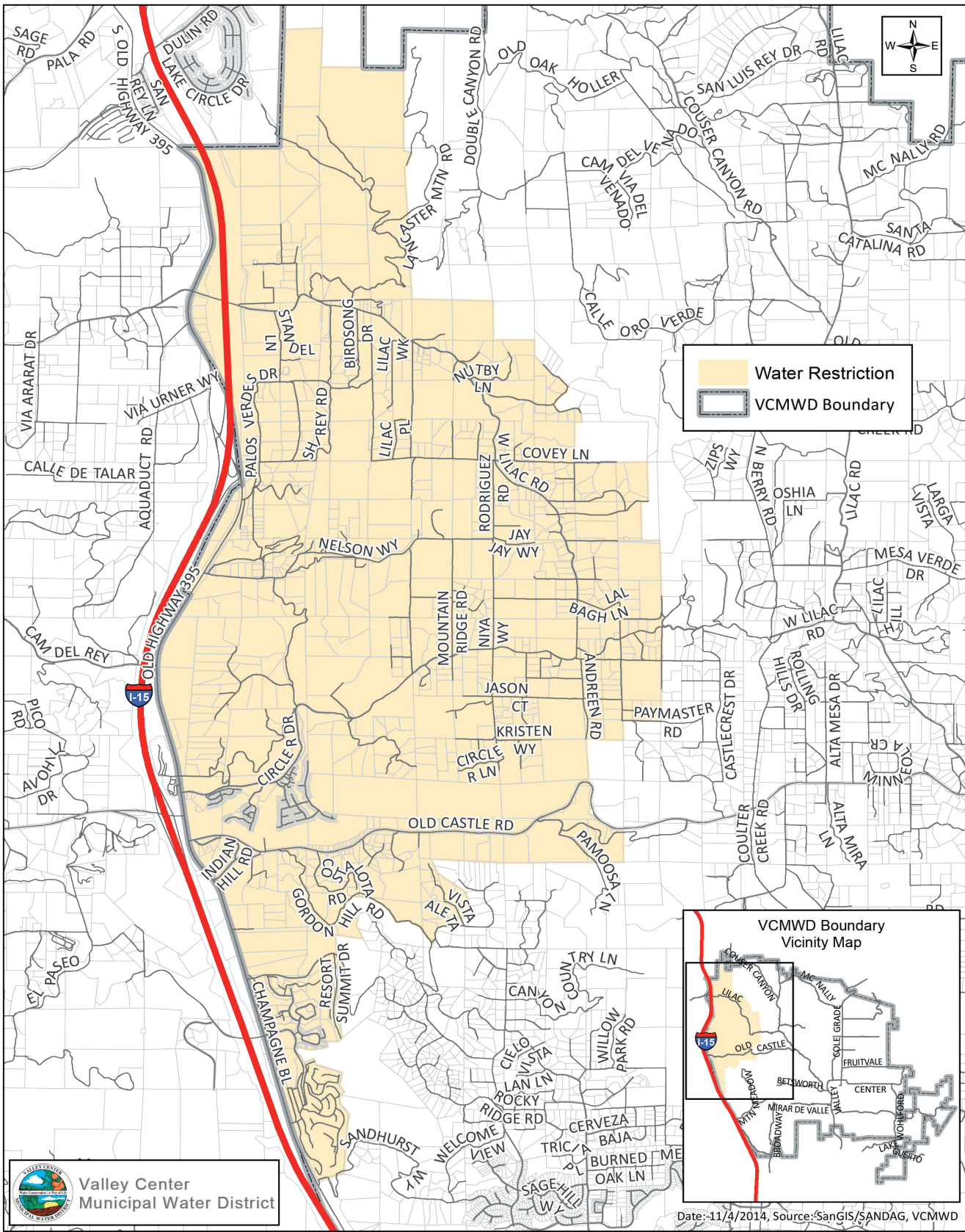
"The District is asking our customers, located within the yellow boundary area of the attached map, to refrain from all outdoor water use, including the watering of landscapes, lawns, agricultural use, use of construction water, washing of vehicles or no filling of fountains, pools, spas or ponds during this emergency shutdown period. Please remember to turn off all outside irrigation/lawn timers during the water use restriction time period. Of course, livestock can continue to be watered.

"We are encouraging you to make adjustments to your irrigation schedule to accommodate this impending emergency shutdown and to pre-water your groves and landscape prior to the March 1st to March 10th restricted period.

"During this shutdown, please check the District website for more information and daily updates, go to our web site at [www.valleycenter-water.org](http://www.valleycenter-water.org), or contact the District office at (760) 735-4500.

"Your cooperation is critical and will be much appreciated."
