

Hidden Meadows Community Foundation Now Open - 2022 **Scholarship Application Window**

The Hidden Meadows Community Foundation has established an Annual Scholarship Award Program and, thanks to generous contributions each year from our neighbors, has each year been able to award scholarships to eligible students preparing to enter college.

When war was declared, Ireland declared neutrality, but not a lot has been written about how the war affected the people and places in Northern Ireland that were still loyal to Britain. This book is considered historical fiction.

"The Elephant of Belfast" by S. Kirk Walsh

The time is October 1940 in Belfast, Ireland. A young girl named Hettie has just witnessed the incredible sight of a young orphaned elephant from India being lowered to ground from an airplane. She is a helper at the zoo where the elephant will be housed and she wants nothing more than to be her caretaker. The elephant is named Violet, and as their bond grows Hettie assumes the title and responsibility of a Zoo Keeper.

Even though Hettie's home life is fractured due to her father's desertion and her older sister's death due to childbirth, the zoo provides a life line for her away from her troubled family. In 1941 when Belfast is bombed by a Lufttwaffe attack, the problems begin for a divided city. Her mother goes to the available underground shelter and Hettie goes to the zoo to help.

The horror starts with the owner's decision concerning which animals will survive and which ones will be eliminated. Even though the zoo was unharmed during the first bombing it might not be so lucky the next time, and the possibility of the animals escaping and endangering the population is a reality he can't allow to happen.

Hettie is determined to save Violet from being killed so she takes her from the zoo out of the city to find shelter. The bombing is one problem, but the growing political tensions between the Irish people themselves put Violet and Hettie in a dangerous situation which threaten their survival.


